APPENDIX B: APPOINTMENT PROCESS

APPOINTMENTS

Appointments to the AS Council are recommended by the President and the Vice Presidents of the Associated Students and approved by AS Council. (See the appendix for a list of each Committee appointment by Executive Officer.) It is important that the entire description contained in the Committee Structure Handbook be reviewed before appointments are made since some are restricted by certain qualifications.

According to the A.S. Code, all Executive appointments shall be approved by a two-thirds majority of Council. Also, all persons nominated for appointment must be present at the A.S. Council (ASC) meeting at the time they are nominated.

In some cases, A.S. Executives listed as members of a committee may decide to delegate that responsibility. If an Executive decides to do so, the Council must approve the nominated designee.

Also included in the lists are positions on committees/boards held by Executives as a result of A.S. office held.

When a new committee is formed, the A.S. President shall recommend to the ASC, which Executive shall make the appointment(s). All appointment recommendations shall be approved by the ASC.
