Apply Early & Every Year

October 1 is the first day to submit your Financial Aid Application for the upcoming school year. If you haven't already filed, do it by March 2! Some funds are awarded on a first-come first-served basis.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- for US Citizens & eligible Non-Citizens
- determines eligibility for federal aid
- determines eligibility for state aid (if CA resident)

OR (only submit one application)

Cal DREAM ACT Application

- for Non-Citizens who reside in CA
- for AB540 eligible students
- determines eligibility for state aid

After you Apply

Students may get selected for a process called verification. During this process the Financial Aid Office is required to verify that information on your FAFSA is accurate. If selected, you will be notified via email regarding which forms and documents you and/or your parent/s will have to submit to our office. These items will be listed on your To-Do List in the Student Center on your myHumboldt portal. *Please note: Only submit requested information.*

Application online via myHumboldt portal

Housing and Dining Charges

The University offers payment plans if you need assistance managing housing and dining fees. Payment plan amounts differ depending on the room type and location you are assigned to and the meal plan you select. - Maintain your eligibility by passing your classes

When you accept and receive financial aid, you also accept the responsibility to maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP). There is a direct relationship between your academics and your financial aid eligibility. Satisfactory Academic Progress requires that you pass your classes each term and complete your primary degree objective within a specific time frame.
