Redwood Field Station (USGS) is currently recruiting for summer 2025 Biological Science Technician positions in Forest Ecology.

Pay: GG-4 or GG-5 (approximately \$21/hour or \$23/hour, depending on experience)

Location: Arcata, California

Positions are full-time, starting in mid-May, ending late August, with the potential for a longer season. We are hiring up to three positions.

Project duties:

- Collect field data for long term forest research projects in Redwood National and State Parks. Measure forest structure and tree growth in old-growth and second-growth forests. Other data collected includes fuels and understory vegetation surveys. Gain knowledge and experience in ecological research and vegetation identification.
- Operates a government motor vehicle.
- Opportunities to assist with data collection for other projects are available on an as-needed basis.

Qualifications: Must be a US Citizen to qualify.

Prefer people with an interest in fire, forest, and/or field ecology; a demonstrated interest and physical ability in working outdoors in challenging field conditions. Successful applicants should have strong interpersonal skills and enjoy working on small field teams.

Please read the announcements and follow the directions outlined below and in the announcement. **Note that there are 2 different announcements/grade levels, depending on your experience. Submit a separate application for each announcement/grade level that you want to be considered for.

To be considered, please attach the following items to your email:

- Cover letter describing interests, qualifications, and contact information
- Resume – candidates must format their resumes correctly to be considered -
 - List the month, day, and year for the beginning and end of each position. (eg.

6/5/21-8/8/21)

- o Include hours worked per week for every job or volunteer position. (eg. 40 hours/week)
- o For all positions with any field or lab component, include detailed descriptions of field or lab duties and be clear that it was field and/or lab work. Include any volunteer experience/positions. Please do NOT eliminate details in your job descriptions to keep your resume to one page. Longer resumes are ok (2-5 pages)
- o If you have field experience listed under a university or college, clearly annotate that the experience was or wasn't related to attaining your degree
- Unofficial transcripts showing degree major/minor and graduation date. If not yet graduated, include a full unofficial transcript so personnel can calculate classes.
- Provide email and/or phone numbers for at least 2 references (3 preferable)
- Put job announcement number in the email subject line for each application:

Qualifications: GG-Level Field Experience OR Work experience OR Education

GG-4: 6 months of field experience OR 2 years of sub-professional work experience OR 1 years of college with courses related to the work of the position to be filled (equivalent to 30 semester/45 quarter hours).

GG-5: 9 months of field experience OR 3 years of sub-professional work experience OR 3 years of college with courses related to the work of the position to be filled (equivalent to 90 semester/135 quarter hours) plus 3 months of lab or field work experience. Sub-professional experience consists of working as a technician or aid in the field or in a laboratory or similar environment.
