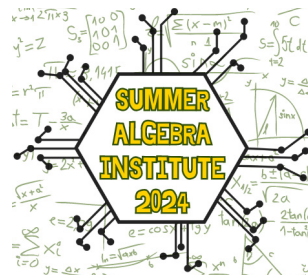

The 2024 CSU Summer Algebra Institute was a tremendous success, engaging over 70 students in a vibrant STEAM program and offering valuable work experience to high school TA interns from Blue Lake Rancheria. We extend our heartfelt thanks to all the staff and project partners, including Blue Lake Rancheria, Redwood Coast K-16 Education Collaborative, and the California State Office of Extended Education for their support and contributions. The program included EdReady math sessions, robotics, art projects, Cal Poly Humboldt campus tours, and insightful talks from guest speakers representing organizations such as CalTrans, Redwood Energy Authority, Arcata Fire Department, and the US Forest Service. Special thanks to the Cal Poly Humboldt Vertebrate Museum for hosting an educational owl pellet dissection, which was a standout experience for the students.

## 2024 TRIO ETS College Tour

The 2024 TRIO Educational Talent Search College Tour was an inspiring and valuable experience for everyone involved. Organized in partnership with the Redwood Coast K-16 Education Collaborative, the tour offered students a firsthand look at college life and potential career paths in health care and education.

Over the course of 4 days and 5 nights, 43 high school students and 5 chaperones explored 7 university campuses, including Cal Poly Humboldt, UC Davis, and Sonoma State. The itinerary included staying in Cal Poly Humboldt dorms and touring the library, where students experienced a 3D anatomy system. Additional highlights were educational and enjoyable visits to the Exploratorium in San Francisco and the Marine Mammal Center.

With a profound commitment to fostering connections and empowering students, Jasmyn brings a wealth of experience in her previous role as a TRIO Student Office Assistant and a passion for empowering students to reach their fullest potential.

Over the summer, Jasmyn was invited to join 150 people from around the US for a trip to Cuba with the Venceremos Brigade. "Most of all, I enjoyed connecting through cultural exchanges and cultivating solidarity. My goal is to become a professor who not only teaches but also takes students into the community to experience and be a part of real-world change."

Durante el verano, Jasmyn se unió a 150 personas de todo Estados Unidos en un viaje a Cuba con la Brigada Venceremos. "Sobre todo, disfruté conectarme a través de intercambios culturales y cultivar la solidaridad. Mi objetivo es convertirme en un profesor que no sólo enseñe sino que también lleve a los estudiantes a la comunidad para que experimenten y sean parte del cambio del mundo real".



Reflecting on their own educational journey, Jasmyn recounts, "Before college, I didn't see it as an achievable goal. It was an AVID class that opened my eyes to the possibilities and provided me with the structure and support I needed. The encouragement from teachers and advisors helped me realize my potential and step out of my comfort zone." Their personal experiences have shaped their approach to supporting students. "I want to create connections that empower students to pursue their dreams, even when those dreams seem out of reach. My goal is to help students see that their aspirations are attainable and to support them in pursuing what they love." Having navigated college life from a place of uncertainty to becoming a mentor, Jasmyn is keen to bring that same supportive spirit to their new role. "During college, I was involved in various programs like EOP and RAMP, which helped students transition successfully. My work with juvenile hall recreation programs and my role in TRIO events taught me the value of direct interaction with students and the impact of seeing events come to life."

Al reflexionar sobre su propio recorrido educativo, Jasmyn cuenta: "Antes de la universidad, no lo veía como una meta alcanzable. Fue una clase de AVID que me abrió los ojos a las posibilidades y me brindó la estructura y el apoyo que necesitaba. El estímulo de profesores y asesores me ayudaron a desarrollar mi potencial y a salir de mi zona de confort". Sus experiencias personales han dado forma a su enfoque para apoyar a los estudiantes. "Quiero crear conexiones que permitan a los estudiantes perseguir sus sueños, incluso cuando esos sueños parezcan fuera de su alcance. Mi objetivo es ayudar a los estudiantes a ver que sus aspiraciones son alcanzables y apoyarlos en la búsqueda de lo que aman". Después de haber transitado la vida universitaria desde un lugar de incertidumbre hasta convertirse en mentora, Jasmyn está ansiosa por aportar ese mismo espíritu de apoyo a su nuevo rol. "Durante la universidad, participé en varios programas como EOP y RAMP, que ayudaron a los estudiantes a realizar una transición exitosa. Mi trabajo con los programas de recreación de centros juveniles y mi papel en los eventos TRIO me enseñaron el valor de la interacción directa con los estudiantes y el impacto de ver los eventos venir a la vida."

# 3 Steps to FAFSA/CADAA Completion

## 1 CREATE A STUDENTAID.GOV ACCOUNT (For FAFSA filers only)

**Your studentaid.gov account (FSA ID) serves as your legal, electronic signature for FAFSA\***

*(Note: studentaid.gov account not required for CA Dream Act Application (CADAA) for AB 540 eligible students)*

### Tips for studentaid.gov account creation:

- Any parent contributors and student all need their own account
- U.S. citizens verify identity with SSN, undocumented parent contributors of FAFSA filers verify using other information.
- Don't use your high school email address
- Ensure information is accurate, but progress quickly. If the account creation form times out it can mean starting the process all over.
- Save your account information where you'll remember, you'll need it every year to renew your FAFSA!

**Note:** Accounts are required in order to access and complete the FAFSA. It's best to create and troubleshoot your account well before it's time to file the FAFSA to ensure the application process goes smoothly.

## 2 FILL OUT THE FAFSA/CADAA

### ATTEND A CAL-SOAP CASH FOR COLLEGE WORKSHOP

*Cal-SOAP offers in-class Cash For College workshops at many high schools as well as after school workshops open to all senior students and parents that provide expert support in FAFSA/CADAA completion. *Access the FAFSA at [studentaid.gov](https://studentaid.gov) or the CADAA at [dream.csac.ca.gov](https://dream.csac.ca.gov).*

### What you will need:

- Studentaid.gov accounts for all contributors (FAFSA only)
- Social Security card or number if you have one (FAFSA only)
- Driver's license, if you have one
- 2023 income and tax information
- List of colleges interested in attending
- Students need contributor SSN (if they have one), date of birth, and email in order to invite them to contribute to the FAFSA.
- Any records of untaxed income such as child support payments, combat pay, short-term disability, or worker's compensation
- Verify all information before submitting

## 3 NEED HELP? ASK COLLEGE ACCESS PROFESSIONALS!

Ask your academic counselor or other college access staff at your school site if you have questions about the financial aid application process. You can also visit [studentaid.gov](https://studentaid.gov) for FAFSA support, or [dream.csac.ca.gov](https://dream.csac.ca.gov) for CADAA support.

## Financial Aid Timeline for Seniors

### SEPTEMBER - NOVEMBER

- Studentaid.gov account creation.** FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)-eligible students and any parent contributors on the FAFSA will need their own accounts to access and sign the FAFSA.
- Apply for scholarships** - [fastweb.com](https://www.fastweb.com) and [collegeboard.org](https://collegeboard.org) are both excellent sources for national scholarships.
- CSS Profile opens October 1 and is due February 1st** for all regular decision students. Some private colleges require this supplemental application to qualify students for institutional aid. See [cssprofile.collegeboard.org](https://cssprofile.collegeboard.org) for more information.

### DECEMBER - MARCH

- Complete FAFSA or CADAA** (California Dream Act Application, for AB 540 eligible students). **Expected to release December 1** for the following year. The submission deadline for Cal Grant Consideration at a 4-year college is **March 2nd\***, but students should submit by the earliest financial aid deadline of the schools to which they are applying. Check the priority financial aid deadlines of the colleges you've applied to.
- FAFSA Submission Summary (FSS) review.** Ensure you have successfully submitted and completed your FAFSA by reviewing your FSS, available at [studentaid.gov](https://studentaid.gov) a few days after submitting your FAFSA.
- Continue applying for scholarships.** Humboldt Area Foundation scholarships open **January 15** and close **March 3**.
- WebGrants 4 Students.** Create your WebGrants account about a week after you submit your FAFSA or CADAA to check your Cal Grant award status. Check your account regularly for status updates and to fulfill any additional requirements to claim your grant should you be awarded.
- Complete Verification.** Some colleges may require additional documentation to verify the information on your FAFSA or CADAA. Send additional documents to a college's financial aid office only upon request. If you are selected for verification, you must submit all requested documents by the college's deadline before you can receive your financial aid.
- Review and compare financial aid offers** from all colleges applied to.

*\*Subject to change for the 2024-25 academic year. Information accurate as of 8/9/24.*

### APRIL - SEPTEMBER

- Intent to enroll and tuition deposit at 4-year colleges usually due May 1st.**
- September 2nd** is the FAFSA/CADAA submission deadline for Cal Grant consideration at a California Community College.
