

Prior to the event we planned for a minimum of 4 teams to participate with a maximum of 8 teams. When considering the fact that many more participants would show up on the day of the event hoping to get onto a team as a free agent. Therefore, we created potential schedules for every amount of teams from 4-8 so we had contingency plans in order on the day of the event.

We had a total of 4 teams, 24 participants during the event who had created teams on IMLeagues. This amount of participants was lower than our expected turnout but was as successful as you could imagine. The ratio of community members to students was 7 to 17.

Teams played in a round-robin tournament format, which allows each team an opportunity to play everyone. Plus a semi-final and final afterward. Teams played 5 games each throughout the day, from 10:30 am-2:30 pm.
