Suicide Safety Plan Our Goal - Zero Harm

Community Need Statement

The Safety Plan is created for patients who are discharged from medical settings, such as the Waterfront Recovery Center. Creating a safety plan for patients recovering from substance use disorder is crucial to ensure the patients to not repeat their same past behavior or come across feelings of suicide. Before patients are discharged they have an opportunity to sit down one-on-one with a clinician to fill out their safety plan. For patients leaving it is imperative for the safety plan to include names, addresses, phone numbers, and/or locations for support groups or other agencies the client can easily access.

Dr. Ruby Bayan was willing to brainstorm with us to create a safety plan that is able to help reduce the risk of future harm to the client. Finding ways the patients can prevent future crises and have a quick and easy resource to help prevent that. We worked together to create a plan that was easy to read, easy to follow and does not overwhelm the patient should they be experiencing a crisis.

Our safety plan aims for reducing factors that may increase the risk of repeating harmful behaviors and suicide. With implementing our safety plan, we hope to limit the risk of repeating substance use because clients have their two page packet to look at and utilize their plan they put together. Along with their plan there is a page of resources and hotline numbers past patients can use to keep themselves safe and sober.


