# The Kids Will Be Alright: Addressing Teens' Needs for Connection After Covid Isolation

## **Community Need Statement**

- Covid-19 lockdowns impacted teenagers' mental health and social development
- Del Norte County has high ACE scores, including high rates of bullying of LGBTQIA2S+ students and students of color, and high rates of depression and isolation (kidsdata.org).
- Sunset's level of support is a protective factor.

## Method

- Met with students to build relationships since September 2022
- Surveyed and interviewed students to determine need
- Compiled research from students and peer-reviewed articles to provide the focus of intervention
- Created curriculums and identified local resources
- We focused on **self-love**, **self-care**, communicating emotions, media literacy, relationship values, role models, visualization, body-centering, affirmations, journaling, and confidence
- Collaborated with Kim to facilitate groups, held groups in alliance with students
- Engaged in reflection and received feedback
